The PVHS Music Department uses Google Classroom as a method of organization and communication with students. Students will turn in assignments and assessments on Google Classroom. Please see Mr. Heimlich or Mr. Wolfe for the login information.

## Course Descriptions

Below you will find a list of music ensembles in the PVHS Music Department. All classes cover music fundamentals, music notation, music theory, sight reading, music history, ear training, instrumental/vocal fundamentals, and technique (scales, arpeggios, etc.). State and national curriculum standards will be covered throughout the year as well. We will have many performances during the year throughout the school, community, and North State.

Wind Ensemble is a year long course for students who have played an instrument for multiple years and would like to perform at an advanced level. Audition required.

Concert Band/Symphonic Band is a year long course for students who have played an instrument at least one year or would like to learn an instrument. No audition required.

Choir is a year long course for students wanting to pursue vocal music. No experience or audition necessary!
Jazz Ensemble I is a year long course for students who have played an instrument for multiple years and would like to perform at an advanced level. Audition required.

Jazz Ensemble II is a before school ensemble that plays a wide variety of music. The class meets Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 6:30am to 7:40am (no class on Wednesday). To be a member of the Jazz Ensemble II, you must be enrolled in concert band or choir. Furthermore, you must have minimum competency on your instrument. No audition required for Jazz II.

Small Groups are extracurricular ensembles that meet at various times. Admittance is based on audition only. The size of the ensembles will be at the director's discretion. Ensembles will be based on student interest and the director's discretion. Ensembles may include: Jazz Combo I, Jazz Combo II, Dixieland Combo, Chamber Choir, Jazz Choir, Glee Club, etc.

Note: Students may be switched out of an auditioned ensemble (Wind Ensemble and Jazz I) to a different ensemble if they are not meeting the standard of performance, as decided by the Director and/or the Principal.

## Equipment and Supplies

1. Instruments (band): A VERY limited number of school instruments are available for check out on a first come, first serve basis. It is highly encouraged that each student purchase or rent their own instrument. If you are at all able to rent or purchase your own instrument, it would provide another student a chance to play that instrument, as we do not have enough for every student. However, I understand if this can not be done. A list of recommended brands is on the website. There are good and bad instruments, so please choose carefully!
2. Instrument specific needs (band): Each student will need to have the following accessories for their instrument. These items will need to be purchased at the music store. Please check the website for specific recommendations.
a. Flute: cleaning rod, cleaning cloth
b. Reed instruments: 2-3 good reeds, reed guard, cork grease, cleaning swab.
c. Brass Instruments: valve/slide oil/grease, mutes
d. Percussion: drum sticks, stick bag
3. Music: Each student will be assigned sheet music, a folder, and method book. Students are expected to take care of it, as well as have it at rehearsal everyday. Students will be charged the following for items that are lost or destroyed: $\$ 10$ for method books and $\$ 20$ for folders.
4. Pencil: The prepared music student always has a pencil in rehearsal! I will test you on this.
5. Uniforms: It is expected that every student dress as follows for performances. If you do not have any of the above items, please see your instructor, as the school has a limited number of items available for loan.

Concert Dress for formal performances:
Option \#1: PVHS Music dress. Black flats and black socks/stockings. Students will be charged $\$ 75$ for lost or destroyed dresses.

Option \#2: Black suit jacket, black collared dress shirt, PVHS tie, black pants, black socks, and black dress shoes. Students will be charged $\$ 20$ for lost or destroyed PVHS tie. There are a number (not a lot) of PVHS suit jackets that can be borrowed - Students will be charged $\$ 50$ for lost or destroyed suit jackets.

Informal performances: music t-shirt and jeans/shorts.
Marching Band Uniforms: Marching Uniforms will be checked out to band students. Uniforms include bibbers (pants), jacket, cape, hat, spats, plume. Students are expected to take good care of the uniforms, and they are to remain at school. Students will be charged $\$ 355$ for lost or destroyed complete marching uniforms, or individually: Jacket - $\mathbf{\$ 1 4 0}$, Cape - $\mathbf{\$ 7 5}$, bibbers - $\mathbf{\$ 5 0}$, hat - $\mathbf{\$ 6 0}$, spats - $\$ 15$, plume - $\$ 15$.

Marching Band/Dress Shoes: Band students need to purchase a pair of marching band shoes - a specific pair. They can be used for all four years, and can be used for ALL formal band performances as well. Information for purchasing is below.

## Grading

Students will earn points on a point system in the following categories:

1. Music Theory/History/Listening Assignments (15\%)
2. Performance Assessments: Students will earn points for various musical performance (playing/singing) assessments. Students are expected to practice and know the music they are assigned. (15\%)
3. Attendance/Participation: (70\%)
a. Students will earn points for each performance. Please check the calendar for required dates and times (there are events that are not required). Students are expected to attend every REQUIRED performance. In the event of illness or emergency, please email me as soon as possible to alert me of what is going on. In all instances, COMMUNICATION is the key - please communicate with me.
b. Additionally, each student will earn points for being prepared and engaged in the ensemble. Points will be deducted for lack of participation and preparation.
c. FOR MARCHING BAND ONLY: Every Tuesday night is a combined Marching Band rehearsal from 5:30pm8:30pm. It is expected that students attend these rehearsals. If a student misses a rehearsal during the week of a Marching Band performance, they may be ineligible to perform that week.
~Late Work: Late work will be accepted up to one week past the due date, with a deduction of one letter grade per day. $\sim$ Grading Scale: The Pleasant Valley High School Grading Scale will be used to assign grades.

## Classroom Management/Policy:

PVHS Music Students will always follow the Viking Circle: EXCELLENCE, COMMITMENT, INTEGRITY, RESPECT, CHAMPIONS, LEARNING. This includes towards yourself, others, equipment, the purpose, and the music. If a student chooses not to respect any of the above, the following steps will be taken: Student/Parent/Teacher conference, Counselor referral, Administrative referral.

Additionally:

1. Tardies: You are tardy if you are not in your seat when the tardy bell rings. Your participation grade will be affected.
2. School Rules must be obeyed at all times. This applies on field trips and off campus events, as well.
3. Cleanliness and Organization: There is a lot of equipment in the band and choir room and we expect you to help keep it clean and organized. Students will be expected to put away their equipment everyday.
4. Students will not use equipment that does not belong to them.

## Fundraising

Every member of the PVHS Music Department is asked to fundraise in order to fund the many activities and events that we put on. All money goes towards trips and supplies. Non-participation may result in ineligibility for trips and other fundraised events, as decided by the Principal and Director.

## Music Boosters

The PVHS Music Boosters - a registered 501c3 non-profit - is a group of parents and students who work hard to raise funds in order to support the PVHS Music Department. The Booster Meeting schedule is on pvhsmusic.com. For more information, please see the website, and please try to attend a meeting! Many hands make light work!

## Grades and Participation

Co-Curricular and extra-curricular participation is critical to the success of our program. To participate in co-curricular events, students must maintain a grade of C or higher in their particular music class, and an overall school GPA of 2.0 or higher with no Fs. Additionally, all student discipline must be cleared prior to participation. Lastly, any disciplinary incidents resulting in a Saturday School assignment or Suspension may result in exclusion from participation, subject to review by the teacher and/or an administrative designee. Separate trip agreements with its own set of rules and regulations, will be sent home for certain trips.

## Music Council

Students may participate in the Music Council, which will be responsible for planning and implementing many of the activities that the band and choir will participate in. Meetings will be held during lunch regularly, exact time TBA. Officers will be elected by the band and choir classes.

## Honor Band and Select Choir

There are several Honor Bands and Select Choirs that students may take part in. All require an audition. Students must meet the behavior expectations as set forth in this handbook to participate in such ensembles. See the calendar for dates.

## Private Lessons

It is highly recommended (but not required) that students receive private lessons. There are many people in Chico that are excellent musicians and teachers. Private lessons are THE single BEST way to improve playing ability! Please ask me for more information.
